Who we are

The V&A is a family of museums dedicated to the **power of creativity**. Our mission is to **champion design and creativity** in all its forms, advance cultural knowledge, and inspire makers, creators and innovators everywhere. We share a 5,000-year-old story of creativity through **exhibitions, events, educational programmes, digital experiences, conservation, research**, and an ever-evolving national collection of over 2.8m objects spanning **every creative discipline**.

Learning at the V&A builds creative confidence in all our audiences, and champions the skills needed to drive the future of the creative economy. Through a responsive and relevant portfolio of activity, we strive to inspire current and future generations of artists, creatives, designers, and innovators.



Who we are (cont)

The V&A's schools and colleges offer includes a suite of onsite workshops and SEND workshops that use design thinking pathways as problem solving for real world problems where design acts as a positive change maker. This pedagogical approach forms the basis for the V&A's approach to schools programming and the wider schools offer.

The Learning and Digital team work with Adobe residents feeding into current programming and building new, expanded programming. The Adobe Creative Residency at the V&A is fresh approach to bring making into the museum. This programme enables us to employ three full-time Residents, five days a week for 12 months. Each Resident works with a designated audience to bring creativity, design and making to diverse audiences. The programme is supported by the Adobe Foundation, and runs alongside the Adobe Creative Residency Programmes internationally.

About the role

The Schools and Colleges Producer will develop and deliver the ongoing V&A schools programme, evaluating and iterating the programme to meet the needs of our audiences. Your key responsibilities are:

Programme development and delivery: The Producer – Schools Programmes will contribute to the development and delivery of an engaging, high-quality offer for schools, ensuring an integrated approach to all programming. The Producer – Schools Programmes will oversee, develop, and deliver activities, projects, and content to support the Senior Producer and Team Leader, including the planning, preparation, and delivery of the core onsite workshop programme, SEND workshop programme, and associated resources. They will manage workshop leaders to maintain a consistently high-quality offer, ensuring periodic updates and adaptations to meet audience needs. The role includes writing risk assessments, learning contracts, content development, reporting, and ongoing evaluation to support programme enhancement. The Producer will oversee the delivery of the National Video Archive of Performances (Schools Screen).

Budget management: The Producer will also oversee core budget management. Using phased budgets to programme within a lean budget. The Producer will be responsible for generating income from workshops and teacher twilights.

Teacher provision: The producer will lead on Teacher Twilights and production of teacher resources. The producer will work with the Senior Producer to map resources against wider themes relating to the Adobe Creative Resident work.

Communication with audience: The Producer will be responsible for marketing the schools offer in collaboration with partners at Young V&A and the V&A's internal marketing team. The Producer will be responsible for responding to schools requests via the schools inbox.


New programming: The Producer will work with the Senior Producer and Team Leader on new programming and initiatives including V&A Schools, a unique provision for home school audiences, and collaborative work that meets shared goals.

Working with external stakeholders: The Producer will collaborate with external stakeholders and sector partners to reach shared goal.

Equality, Inclusion and Diversity: The Producer will work collaboratively to expand the reach of the schools programme onsite, offsite, and digitally, with a focus on representation, diversity, inclusion, and accessibility. This will include targeted efforts to increase engagement with students from low socio-economic backgrounds and those with additional access needs.

Working collaboratively: The Producer will play a key role in the production and delivery of large-scale and bespoke activities such as the Upstart Schools Festival, DesignLab Nation and V&A Innovate. The producer will work with colleagues in Visitor Experience and other departments to ensure that audience needs are met.

What we're looking for

- Experience producing, delivering, and hosting programmes for key stage 1-5
 - Experience with SEND audiences
 - Up-to-date knowledge of schools learning in museums, cultural organisations or wider educational initiatives. Knowledge of pressures and constraints on school interactions with the cultural sector. Understanding of the National Curriculum and formal education
 - Demonstrable experience of facilitating and project managing high quality creative learning activities and workshops for a schools audience in a museum or similar environment
 - Experience of developing and developing inclusive creative learning programmes that support learners that address barriers faced by learners currently under-represented in museum audiences.
 - Experience of managing budgets
 - Experience of working with evaluation and external evaluators, to use data to inform programme development, to understand how learning affects change- e.g., skills, attitudes, values and behaviours
 - Strong administrative skills; understanding of importance of attention to detail.
